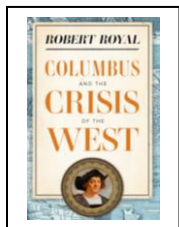

President's Report

Vote on November 8th

Go into a booth, in person to vote. Let us know if you need someone to take you. Republicans are focusing on issues that matter to families and voters. We stand for self-reliance, free enterprise, property rights, and individual liberty. Our education system must be accountable to parents, taxpayers, and students. Democrats have brought crisis after crisis: a supply chain crisis and inflation at a 40-year high; a baby formula shortage that has left families struggling to feed infants; gas prices well above \$5; a disastrous foreign policy and rising crime. California has been a leader in bail reform. In April of 2020, the state of California implemented the "Emergency Bail Schedule," which set the bail for most violent offenses at an unfathomable \$0.00. Guess what a staggering 70% of violent criminals released on a \$0.00 bail between April of 2020 and June of 2021 ALL have in common. They all went on to commit more crimes. In addition, we have an out-of-control border crisis. Nearly 5 million illegal aliens have crossed the border since January 20, 2021. So far this year, of those encountered at the southern border, over 500,000 illegal aliens have been released into the interior of the country by Border Patrol. In addition to depressing the wages of low-skilled American citizens, committing crimes beyond their initial breaking of American immigration laws, and potentially undermining the integrity of elections, the illegal aliens cost taxpayers \$20.4 billion every year.

Americanism? Who Is Teaching It and What Are They Teaching?

"Students and parents across the country are finally asking tough questions about anti-American curriculums. Immigrants like my mother and grandfather found refuge in America because for all its problems, it's a wonderful place full of generous and open-minded people. The nation's schools have a duty to teach students that basic truth."

The statement comes from a piece in The Wall Street Journal, written by Sahar Tartak, now a freshman at Yale. Her story was one of being insulted and reprimanded by her former high school administration and teachers in Great Neck, NY (with a "school district ranked as America's third-best") because she challenged them over an issue with a "racial equity" group. One teacher cut her off with this most inappropriate teacher-student communication: "If you're not on board with systemic racism, I have trouble with that, girlfriend."

Ms. Tartak is to be commended for her knowledge of right and wrong, her appreciation of American exceptionalism, and her courage. She gives us a glimmer of hope for the future of America. The tenets of critical race theory, transgenderism, and other highly contentious school curricula need to be challenged — at minimum, investigated. Ms. Tartak has led the way with her WSJ essay.

Legislative Report

November Ballot Initiatives

Proposition 1 - Adds a guarantee of unrestricted reproductive freedom which includes abortion and contraceptive rights to the state constitution. Supersedes current state law which prohibits abortions after fetal viability unless the mother's health is in danger.

Proposition 26 – Allows sports betting at tribal casinos and horse racetracks. Adds in-person sports betting, roulette, and dice games to the currently allowed casino card games and slot machines. Excludes betting on high school sports and college sports involving a California team. It would also allow sports betting at horse racetracks. Ten percent of racetrack profits would be placed in the California State Wagering Fund leading to increased school funding.

Proposition 27 – Allows online sports betting through licensed tribes or affiliated large gaming companies. Would increase profits of out-of-state gaming companies. Some of the revenues would be used for the homeless, gambling addiction programs, and non-gaming tribes. If both propositions 26 and 27 pass, a judge will decide how to resolve conflicts between the measures.

Proposition 28 – Guarantees public school and community college art and music education funding. Requires 1% of Prop. 98 monies be spent on art and music. Spends 80% on teachers. Supplies plus funding to schools in disadvantaged neighborhoods.

Proposition 29 – Requires a trained physician, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant to be on-site at dialysis clinics. This will unnecessarily increase dialysis costs and lead to fewer dialysis sites. This is a union driven initiative. SEIU-UHW leader Dave Regan has a history of using ballot initiatives to fight corporate opponents.

Proposition 30 – Taxes income over 2 million dollars for electric vehicle program. Adds a 1.75% income tax to the current 13.3% marginal state tax and the 37% marginal federal tax. Deploys confiscated money to subsidize electric cars in an “equitable” manner. Designates 25% of funds to train and hire firefighters. *We need to strengthen our electric grid before promoting more electric vehicles.*

Proposition 31 – A yes vote upholds a 2020 flavored tobacco ban. A no vote allows the sale of flavored tobacco products. *We urgently need to address the fentanyl laced counterfeit pills killing our youth and the homeless drug addicts lying on our city streets.*

The California GOP: neutral on Prop. 28 and opposed to the rest.

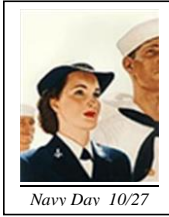
