September – The Month America Celebrates Her Constitution

Constitution Day (Sep 17) commemorates the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution by thirty-nine brave men on September 17, 1787. Those men drew from many sources to take basic concepts of freedom and developed a document that almost immediately became the envy of the civilized world.

That document put power in the hands of the people, not in government, and it specifically limited the power of a national government. Its purpose was to create a central Federal government strong enough to unify the various states, act in their defense, and to adjudicate interstate disputes, but otherwise as weak as possible. It was never designed to promise grandiose benefits and principles, nor to act as a comprehensive guide to how the individual states must construct their laws.

My, how things changed. Progressive leaders (notably Wilson, FDR, LBJ and Obama) and compliant courts succeeded in implementing a national Progressive agenda. Today we have a huge regulatory state, administrative state, and welfare state all emanating from the Federal government.

This year as we commemorate those thirty-nine brave men in 1787, we must also note and praise today's brave men and women who are doing yeomen's work to overturn the Progressive, anti-American agenda.

Legislative Report

Common ground!

The global food supply is under threat due to drought and other adverse weather.

Fires and explosions have crippled multiple U.S. food processing plants in the past couple of years.

Governmental policies such as shutdowns, the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and Biden's war on fossil fuel have interfered with supply chains and increased the cost of food production.

The FDA's shutdown of an Abbott baby formula factory because of safety concerns without making provisions to ensure adequate supplies shows the limitations of our federal bureaucracy.

In 2013 a Chinese company was allowed to buy the Virginia company Smithfield Foods. The world's largest pork producer which benefits from vertical integration is under CCP control.

China was also recently allowed to purchase farmland in North Dakota near the Grand Forks Airforce Base, raising U.S. security concerns.

California has about 40 million acres of privately held agricultural land. About 2.7% of this land is owned by foreign investors. State Senator Melissa Hurtado, the Democrat who represents District 14 which is in the San Joaquin Valley, wants to protect our farmland. **Senate Bill 1084 The Food and Farm Security Act** if passed will prevent additional foreign ownership of agricultural land after January 1, 2023.

Senator Hurtado is also concerned about hedge fund and foreign investors profiteering from purchases of water rights and the potential threat to small rural farmers.

Environmental rule for thee

CEQA, the California Environmental Quality Act, was signed into law by Governor Reagan in 1970. CEQA requires an environmental review study for most development projects. This study allows opponents to use litigation to delay, raise costs, or stop a project. Democrats protect their preferred projects by exempting them from the law. Examples are **SB 9**, which allows subdivision of lots zoned for single family homes, **SB 10** which streamlines zoning for 10-unit apartment buildings, and Senator Wiener's recently passed **SB 922** which exempts bike lanes and some rapid transit projects in urbanized areas.

Drip by drip?

Governor Newsom proudly signed into law AB 1594 which allows the victims of gun violence to sue firearm manufacturers and dealers.



Excerpted from the CFRW Capitol Update:

SB-866 – Minors: Vaccine Consent – Existing law prescribes various circumstances under which a minor may consent to their remedial care and treatment without the consent of a parent or guardian.

These circumstances include, among others, authorizing a minor 12 years of age or older ... to consent to medical care related to the diagnosis or treatment of the disease ...

This bill would additionally authorize a minor 15 years of age or older to consent to vaccines that meet specified federal agency criteria.


