Legislative Report

Congress has passed three bills to date, two of which involved promoting women in the sciences and business. Perhaps these bills were a sop to the Women's March because they are inconsistent with conservative governance. Other than that, Congress has been busy proposing, but not disposing.

Although the Senate and House have not yet come together to pass any new laws, they are laying the groundwork for doing so. Perhaps by the time this newsletter is published, Republican plans to repeal Obamacare will have reached fruition. A savvy friend believes, however, that President Trump will let Congress play for a few months and then force a deal by July 31.

To date, most of Congress's actions involve local boondoggles, adjustments to existing laws, or meaningless feel-good initiatives. Still, there are a handful of proposed bills that could result in new laws that would stop using federal money to fund abortions; put federal lands for sale on the open market to help reduce the debt; improve the VA's ability to provide care for America's veterans; increase America's defensive capabilities against terrorism; clean up procedural abuses in the federal court system; and - a small but helpful initiative - require callers to display accurate information on Caller ID.

Congress has yet to take action on President Trump's proposed budget. However, it is reasonable to believe that, by the time Congress has finished, the cuts the President has proposed will have magically morphed into massive new expenditures and increased federal debt. Big Bird will rise again.

Meanwhile, in California, the Assembly is contemplating requiring that California get 100% of its electricity from renewable energy by 2045; having single payer healthcare in California that would cover illegal aliens as well as legal residents; figuring out how to have taxpayers make California's public colleges more affordable, or even free; and reducing taxes on tampons ("gender justice," although we are also being assured that, in a gender fluid world, men can need tampons too). In other words, the California Assembly continues to view its productive residents as unending sources of funds for the Progressive dream factory.

Who Pays for This? – Californians are being fouled with the highest taxes in the country – are these ideas really a good use of their hard-earned money?

The Swamp – The special interests pushing these bills are so powerful they'd be a favorite in any tournament.

... Why? – California's facing serious issues. So why are Capitol Democrats doing the "Big Dance" around housing and transportation to push these do-nothing proposals?

The terrible bills highlighted in the "Capitol Madness" tournament include strong contenders like the proposal to divert much needed road money to social justice programs (AB 1640). Meanwhile, a bill to allow bicycles to occupy a full lane of vehicle traffic (AB 694) has "Cinderella Story" written all over it.

MRWF's Capitol Muse

Recently some conservative students (there must be one or two!) at Middlebury College prevailed upon a faculty member named Allison Stanger to invite the estimable Charles Murray, author of "The Bell Curve" and a half-dozen other works of towering scholarship, to speak on campus. Murray's acceptance of this invitation plunged him head-first into the bonfire of political correctness that has all but consumed modern American academe: Screaming protesters hijacked his event; overwhelmed and silenced Murray; drove him from the auditorium to a secure satellite location from whence he lectured via closed -circuit TV; impeded his and Ms. Stanger's departure therefrom roughly enough that she was whiplashed and concussed; and so disrupted their attempt to dine at a local restaurant that they had literally to leave town in order to sit down and eat.

Attentive observers recognize this disturbing event as quite mundane. But the contrast between Murray's intellectual stature and the students' Hobbesian behavior was sufficiently stark to shock the conscience even of liberal pundits, several of whom penned elite-y columns 'splaining things to us commoners. Of them, Ms. Stanger's own column affords the keenest insight into how the liberal mind makes sense of political hysteria in this Era of Donald Trump.

In "Understanding the Angry Mob That Gave me a Concussion," Ms. Stanger reveals what the event "made clear" - at least to her: "...Americans today are deeply susceptible to a renunciation of reason and celebration of ignorance. They know what they know without reading, discussing or engaging those who might disagree with them. People ... reject calm logic, eager to embrace the alternative news that supports their prejudices."

OK. But then, in a dazzling polemic reversal, Ms. Stanger concludes that the root cause of the protesters' criminal behavior was Donald Trump. Trump! Who, by an "ugly campaign and... presidency" has "demonized Muslims as terrorists and dehumanized many groups of marginalized people...declared the free press an enemy of the people, replaced deliberation with tweeting, and is bent on dismantling the separation of powers and 230 years of progress this country has made toward a more perfect union."

The dispassionate observer must construe Stanger's analysis in one of only two ways: Either (a) the lady is willfully blind to the fact that her charges against Trump perfectly reflect the very "renunciation of reason" and rejection of "calm logic" that she decries; or (b) the concussion has damaged her brain.

The former alternative seems more plausible.

She must be a US citizen, resident of California and have completed two years of college. Deadline: August 15, 2017.
