# **President's Report**

Should any organization involved in illegal activity have all funding pulled, tax exempt status removed, and be prosecuted?

Rep. Lance Gooden, R-Texas, is sounding the alarm about what he says is a secretive and "very organized" operation to bring illegal migrants into the U.S. and facilitate their transport across the country. On February 3, 2022, Rep. Gooden introduced legislation to remove federal funding from U.S. nonprofit organizations that help facilitate illegal entry into the United States. The Stop Federal Funding for Human Trafficking and Smuggling Act would direct the head of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to require federal contracts and grants to be contingent on organizations certifying that they are not involved in either human trafficking or human smuggling, fraud, or bribery at the U.S. border.

"Taxpayer dollars should not be subsidizing a mass invasion of our country and it is time to stop this corrupt operation." Gooden asked, "Are private corporations or foreign organizations funding this travel?" Mark Brnovich, Arizona's Attorney General, warned, "What is occurring at our border is nothing short of chaos and lawlessness, and Americans are paying the price for these intentional and reckless policies--with their safety and their lives. In 2021, at least 46,000 unaccompanied children were transferred in our country's interior. More people are crossing our border every day..." North Carolina Sen. Thom Tillis wrote, "Permitting the use of ICE arrest warrants as travel documents is at best illogical, and at worst a serious threat to our nation's homeland security."



# **Legislative Report**

### **Bureaucrats know best?**

Fortunately, **AB 1400**, the proposed California single-payer healthcare plan has been laid to rest during this election year. This has not stopped our tenacious Democrat office holders led by Dr. Richard Pan, State Senator from Sacramento, from proposing more medical tyranny.

**AB 1993** would require that employers obtain proof of Covid 19 vaccination for all employees and independent contractors. The bill does allow for CDC-approved medical exemptions and for religious belief exemptions. Medical exemptions are rarely given, but can be obtained for a severe allergic reaction to the vaccine or for a history of the officially acknowledged post-vaccination injuries of myocarditis and pericarditis.

**AB 2098** threatens the medical licenses of physicians who disagree with the official Covid 19 narrative. Disagreement with the CDC or FDA is renamed "unprofessional conduct," so that free-thinking physicians can more easily be disciplined by the Medical Board of California

**AB 1797** would establish an immunization registry to facilitate central control.

**SB 866** would allow children 12 years and older to consent to any state promoted vaccination, including those under emergency use authorization.

**SB 871** would add the Covid 19 vaccine, even if still under emergency use authorization, and any future government approved vaccinations to the list of required vaccinations for school attendance. There is no personal belief exemption for the 10 required vaccines, and this bill would remove this exemption for Covid 19 and all future vaccines.

#### Don't exercise your rights on public land?

**SB 915** would eliminate gun sales on public land such as fairgrounds.

#### Will common sense prevail?

**SB 890** proposed by Republican State Senators Nielson and Borgeas would expedite already approved water storage projects allowing water from "atmospheric rivers" or wet years to be stored for use in dry years. Proposition 1 passed in 2014 established a 2.7-billion-dollar bond to increase water storage. According to the California Federated Republican Women Capitol Update of February 10, 2022, not a single project allocated money by the California Water Commission under this proposition has been completed.

# Book Club

Treat yourself to a book for the times; your eyes will open wide.

#### Is Atheism Dead by Eric Metaxas

Fifty years ago, the cover of Time magazine asked the question "Is God Dead?'. On the edition's fiftieth anniversary, Eric Metaxas published in response his book, <u>Is Atheism Dead?</u>. This may be one of the most interesting books I have read. The book is divided into three basic sections: the science, the confirmed history and the more famous debates among past scientists and intellectuals about the existence of God and the beginning of life.

I am a well educated woman but very much of what was taught as "science" when I was young is no longer held to be true. For example, PBS's favorite scientist, Carl Sagan, taught that there were so few requirements to create life that it could likely be found everywhere and lots of people went looking. Scientists have since proven that there are, in fact, so many necessary conditions for life to begin and be sustained that the chances are absolutely infinitesimal that it exists elsewhere. The scientific background Metaxas presents is more than fascinating, including the roles of the sun and the planets at a minimum. The Creation described in the Judeo-Christian Bible and the Big Bang Theory are remarkably alike. Archaeologists have uncovered an amazing number of sites that conform perfectly with the story of the Bible and New Testament. His discussion of many famous atheists shows that most of them could not rationally support atheism and fell off that bandwagon eventually because the world is really too remarkable to be random and "evolved".

Whether the reader is religious or not, this is a very good read where you will learn and think a lot.
