President's Report

Are We Working For Candidates?

I came across this story about our schools and teaching history. It is told by Beth Lambright, a descendant of the Mayflower Pilgrims.

"In November 2011, I [Beth Lambright] was met at the front door by a school principal in Corvallis, who wanted to question me before I entered to be a re-enactor and tell the Thanksgiving story in an accurate and historical, yet fun and age-appropriate, way. Dressed as my 9X-great-grandmother Elizabeth Fisher Hopkins, I had been speaking to multiple public and private schools, as well as adult historical societies and genealogy groups. But in 2011, as I arrived at this school, the principal was worried that I would say something about the Pilgrim ancestors being 'religious,' or that I might have a spiritual message of some kind—a message that she deemed would be clearly 'inappropriate' for them. Once she was satisfied that I had come to relay history, she said, 'The only reason I'm letting you in this classroom is that YOU ARE A REAL DESCENDANT OF THOSE PEOPLE!'

"Has Thanksgiving become too controversial to teach children? The teaching of U.S. history has become a hotbed of controversy, and our country is very divided on what themes a history curriculum should include and who should be the arbiters of textbooks and curriculum."

As MRWF President, I ponder the following questions: What if we have come to the place that the only people who will be allowed to share the history of the Mayflower journey and early Plymouth colony are the ancestors of those "First Comers" or Native Americans? Do we know the Pilgrims' story? Are we prepared to elect people who uphold our principles? Are we working for candidates?

"The United States and the freedom for which it stands, the freedom for which they died, must endure and prosper. Their lives remind us that freedom is not bought cheaply. It has a cost; it imposes a burden. And just as they whom we commemorate were willing to sacrifice, so too must we—in a less final, less heroic way—be willing to give of ourselves."

"I can't claim to know the words of all the national anthems in the world, but I don't know of any other that ends with a question and a challenge as ours does: Does that flag still wave o'er the land of the free and the home of the brave? That is what we must all ask."



Election June 7, 2022 Primary

What is new?

- This election all 'active registered' voters will get a ballot mailed to them at their current address.
- Vote-centers are where you vote in person. There will no longer be local precinct voting locations.
- Hold your ballot, walk in to your Vote Center and vote in person. We recommend you do this rather than mailing your ballot back to the Registrar's office.

Marin Election Countdown:

- **April 28**th Voter Information Guides will be mailed to all Marin County 'registered' voters.
- May 9th Vote-by-Mail ballots are mailed out. As soon as you receive your ballot you can fill it out and mail it back. Recommendation: that you vote on Election Day and vote at your Vote Center in person.
- June 7th Polls are open 7am 8pm at the Election Office and Vote Centers.

Legislative Report

"Red rum, red rum" *

* phrase from the movie The Shining

AB 2223 seeks to protect women and their agents following the death of a fetus (gestational age greater than 20 weeks) or of an infant in the undefined "perinatal period" due to undefined "pregnancy-related causes." Currently, California law only allows an abortion after viability if the life of the mother is in danger. The county coroner is charged with investigating the cause of fetal death after 20 weeks of gestation unless the cause of death was a legal abortion. The proposed law would prohibit a coroner's statement as to the cause of fetal or perinatal death to be used to bring a criminal or civil case "against any person." This bill would legalize late-term abortions and infanticide under the guise of reproductive privacy and must be opposed. California mothers can surrender a newborn infant at a hospital, police department, or fire station with no questions asked under the Safely Surrendered Baby Law. AB2223 was passed in the dead of night on 4/19/2022 by the Assembly Health Committee. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee and then will be on the floor for a vote by the entire Legislature. Follow the progress of this bill here: https://www.californiafamily.org/ab2223/

Big pharma knows best updates

AB 2098 designed to silence physicians who oppose official narratives was passed along party lines by the Assembly Committee on Business and Professions on April 19.

AB 1797 which would create a centralized vaccine registry remains under consideration. Assembly Health Committee hearing tentatively rescheduled for week of 4/25/2022.

SB 1479 which mandates a Covid testing plan for every institution that cares for children passed the Senate Health Committee and has been referred to the Senate Education Committee.

SB 1390 which targets social media "misinformation" is scheduled for a hearing in the Senate Judiciary Committee.

SB 866 which allows minors to consent to vaccination, **SB 871** which mandates Covid 19 vaccination for school age children, **AB 1993** which mandates the Covid 19 vaccine for employment, currently have no scheduled hearing. **SB 1479** which requires police to enforce public health edicts had scheduled a hearing on 4/27 in the Senate Education Committee.

The California Department of Public Health will not require Covid 19 vaccinations for K-12 school attendance before July of 2023.

The visible hand

AB 2932 is a misguided attack on businesses under the guise of raising wages. The bill would force some companies that employ greater than 500 people to decrease the work week to 32 hours while maintaining the same level of pay. This is currently under consideration in the Committee on Labor and Employment.

The Path Your Ballot Takes: Mail It In or Vote It At Your Vote Center/Polling Place

Date: 4/27/2022

Path of Your Vote-By-Mail Ballot

It is -

Picked up by your Postal Carrier, dropped off at a Mail Box/Drop Box or dropped off at your Local Post Office

Processed by local Post Office

Sent to Distribution Center in SF for sorting by county

Sent to Post Office at Marin County Civic Center

Picked up by Voter Registration Clerks

Processed through Diebold machine for signature verification

If signature verified, second sort by Precinct by Diebold machine

Envelope sent to "I and D" to be opened

If signature does not pass verification

Sent for visual signature review with Clerk on machine that verifies 4 signatures at a time

If signature does not clear verification, sent for hand visual review by Clerk

If signature still does not pass, reviewed by Voter Registrar and Deputy Voter Registrar

If questions still exist, Voter sent a letter for signature verification

Verified signatures sent back through Diebold machine for 3rd sort by precinct

Envelopes then opened by clerk and reviewed for completeness/rubber banded in groups of 25

If no problems, put in box for Tabulation

If all choices are not clearly noted, sent for machine Adjudication for" Voter Intent Review" by 2 Clerks

Ballots boxed with 250 ballots and sent to Tabulation for input into electronic machine

No ballot counts are released until 8 pm on election night (if they have passed the above process)

Ballots not processed by election day, and those received after election day (but date stamped by election day and received by the 17 day arrival deadline), will be processed with the above path before the certification date and within 30 days of the election.

Path of Ballots Cast at the Polling Place on Election Day

The Ballots are delivered to the Election Office and fed into a Tabulation machine on election night.

The Count is announced as soon as all ballots have been processed that came in from the Precincts on election night.


