President's Report

The School Choice Initiative president Mike Alexander spoke at the Marin GOP meeting in October 2021. To qualify for the November ballot, 1,500,000 signatures must be submitted by March 30, 2022; Marin is assigned to collect 10,000 signatures. Tief Gibbs has volunteered to be Marin county chair for **School Choice**. She will need the help of every MRWF member.

This is an excerpt from an essay by Sarah Nagle, the senior advisor for **Californians for School Choice**.

In 2019, the National Assessment of Educational Progress showed that only 32% of California's public school fourth graders were proficient readers. If the initiative passes, California parents may request an Educational Savings Account (ESA) be established for their K-12 child. Each ESA will receive \$14,000 per year. Parent choice determines which accredited public, private, or parochial school will receive the ESA funds. Funds can accrue for the student to use at an accredited college or vocational school up until the student turns thirty. Currently California public schools are funded through a combination of bonds, parcel taxes, donations, federal funds, and Prop. 98 funding. The Educational Freedom Act will give parents and kids the freedom to choose a better alternative without costing Californians more money. The state is spending an average of \$21,152 per year for every child enrolled in the public K-12 school system. The Educational Freedom Act is designed to permit a portion of the Prop. 98 funding to follow the child. The Educational Freedom Act has the potential to offer practical, workable educational options to millions of California kids.

The Legacy of Martin Luther King*

On the 50th anniversary of the March on Washington, at which The Reverend Martin Luther King gave his memorable "I Have a Dream" speech, Thomas Sowell used that anniversary to share his reflections — some inspiring and some painful and ominous.

"What was historic about that speech was not only what was said, but how powerfully its message resonated among Americans of that time, across the spectrum of race, ideology, and politics. A higher percentage of Republicans than Democrats voted in Congress for both the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965."

"To say that that was a hopeful time would be an understatement. To say that many of those hopes have since been disappointed would also be an understatement."

Many. . . "of those who celebrate the 'I have a dream' speech today promote the directly opposite approach of group preferences, especially those based on skin color."

"We have a long way to go to catch up to what Martin Luther King said 50 [now 58] years ago. And we are moving in the opposite direction."

Legislative Report

Vaccine Mandates Face Court Challenge

Oracle, GE, 3M, and Verizon are among companies pausing compliance with President Biden's vaccine mandate after the 5th Circuit placed a stay on the OSHA rule. California attorney Mark Meuser, candidate for U.S. Senate, along with attorney Harmeet Dhillon and the [Center for American Liberty](https://www.americanliberty.org/), are among those fighting for medical freedom.

Federal Vaccine Database

On November 30, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 550 with the help of Representative Jared Huffman and 80 Republicans. If approved by the Senate, 400 million dollars will be allocated to expand state and local health departments' ability to collect and report vaccination status to the federal government. The database will destroy medical privacy and allow central monitoring of compliance with unconstitutional vaccine mandates and pave the way for vaccine passports to punish those who still believe in medical freedom. As of 12/1/2021, it is 'Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.'

Abortion Law

In a 5/4 decision the Supreme Court allowed the Texas abortion law to go into effect despite pending challenges in federal court. The law allows private citizens to sue individuals who perform abortions after the fetal heart beat is detectable (about 6 weeks).

In response, Governor Newsom has declared California a "reproductive freedom state." He also has plans to use the logic of the Texas law to limit gun rights in California. "But there is a problem with Newsom's knee-jerk reaction. The Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act, passed in Congress in 2005, was passed to protect manufacturers from lawsuits going after the gun rather than the person who pulled the trigger," reports Kathy Grimes of the California Globe.

Critical Race Theory - California

AB 101 requires a semester long course in ethnic studies for California high school graduation starting in the 2025-26 school year. The CFRW legislative analysis committee recommends that since "the bill allows the curriculum to be developed locally, parents and interested citizens should get involved, asking for a citizen's committee to assist in the formation of the curriculum." The Act treats all K-12 California students equally. An Educational Savings Account (“ESA”) will be established for each K-12 child in California on request. Each ESA will receive \$14,000 per year. ESA funds can be used to pay for tuition at any accredited public, private or parochial school. Any unspent funds will accrue in a low-risk portfolio. Parents would never have direct access to the money. However, homeschool students can also enroll in an ESA and use ESA funds to pay for qualified educational expenses if they enroll in an accredited private school independent study program. Because funds can accrue, families would be able to save the extra money in their accounts for students to use at an accredited college or vocational school up until the student turns 30.

Your MRWF Action commitment:

1. Sign the ballot measure petition at our January 26, 2022 meeting or before then at the MarinGOP office.
2. Take 2 petitions with you and return them with 10 signatures of fellow registered voters you have gathered. Return it to the MarinGOP office.
