Legislative Report

Assemblyman Damon Connolly introduced AB 92, which would prohibit the sale of body armor in California except to law enforcement, military, and emergency services professionals. When asked why he authored the bill, he stated, “Simply put, the widespread availability of military-grade body armor helps mass shooters and criminals kill more people. Keeping the communities in the North Bay and throughout California safe is my greatest priority ...” Will this bill keep California communities safe?

Body armor was worn by 15 of 86 mass shooters in the US between 2010 and 2022. While these are horrible crimes and body armor makes it more difficult to stop a criminal in a gunfight, these are rare occurrences. It is currently a felony for a convicted violent offender to purchase, own, or possess body armor. The proposed new law would instead make it a misdemeanor punishable by a \$5,000 to \$10,000 fine to purchase body armor. Does relaxing the law for known criminals keep California communities safe?

The bill does add an additional felony charge for wearing body armor during the commission of a violent gun crime. Would the risk of an additional sentence of 16 months to 3 years deter use and keep California communities safe?

The bill prohibits most Californians from purchasing body armor for self-protection. Thus for most Californians the penalty is a misdemeanor with a fine of \$5,000 to \$10,000. Does restricting the freedom of Californians to protect themselves from violent criminals keep California communities safe?

The Declaration of Independence states, “We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness...” Does this law protect life? No, the right to self-protection is one of the most basic rights. Does this law promote liberty and the pursuit of happiness? No, it restricts freedom. Please join me in opposing this bill.

Protection of the Educational Rights of Kids

California [AB 659: Cancer Prevention Act](#) also known as the **HPV Vaccine Mandate bill** for school kids was introduced by Assembly Member Aguiar-Curry, and co-authored Assembly Members Wendy Carrillo, Friedman, Kalra, Ortega, Papan, and Blanca Rubio and Senator Wiener.

AB 659 will require the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine to attend 8-12 grade in public or private school, starting January 1 2024.

The bill would clarify the department’s authority to adopt HPV-related regulations for grades below the 8th grade level. By creating new duties for school districts, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

- California would be the first state to have an HPV vaccine mandate **without non-medical exemptions available.** (No personal or religious belief exemptions.)
- The bill would allow for the California Department of Health's authority to use HPV-related regulations for students.
- This bill is another obstacle for equal access to education.

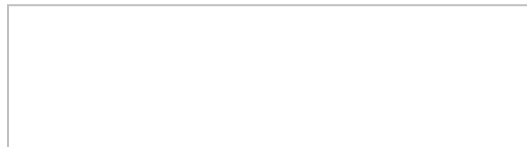
