President's Report

Our recently elected administration has made so many unforced errors that it is hard to keep track. In just a few months, the border is in shambles, inflation is at its highest rate in decades, Biden just gave our enemies our most strategic airfield in the Middle East, and he allowed the foundation of a new, terrorist nation in Afghanistan with many of our citizens abandoned within its borders. He had our military evacuate over 120,000 people from Afghanistan but only about 5,500 were US citizens. Who were the others? A NYT piece recently claimed America "was once a homogenous nation and is finally becoming a gorgeous mosaic." J. Peder Zane, of Real Clear Investigations, took issue with that premise and offered these reasons: "Our nation of immigrants has been a multicultural mecca from the get-go; the American experience has always been defined by the challenge of living with difference." He gives examples and continues:

"Has any other nation given rise to more religious denominations, sects and utopian communities? This has always caused tensions, [...] The miracle — and there is no better word for it — is that our country eventually found a way to unum this pluribus, creating unity while respecting difference. [...]"

"The promise was that no matter one's culture and beliefs, all would be treated the same. No society has achieved that ideal, but America has come closer than most. Tragically, powerful forces now want to erase this history and throw away this secret sauce."

Voter Registration September Report

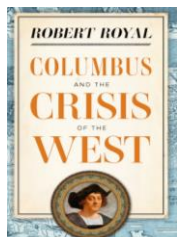
Our next Voter Registration effort will be when you make the effort. This month get into 'Action'. Here are two assignments that MRWF needs to be active in:

Legislative Report

Your California Legislators

California governor and legislature eliminate most single family residential zoning

SB-9 allows the owner of a lot currently zoned for residential single-family homes to split the lot in half and allows for 2 housing units on each half-lot provided the owner signs an affidavit attesting under penalty of perjury that one of the housing units will be their principal residence for 3 years. *There are no residence requirements if the owner is a community land trust or a qualified nonprofit corporation.* There is no requirement for on-site parking if within ½ mile of public transportation. The California Environmental Quality Act does not apply to this law and public hearings are not required. Properties in rural areas, flood plains and historic districts are excluded.

SB-10 allows cities to fast track without environmental review 10-unit multi-family housing near mass transit or in urban in-fill sites (vacant or undeveloped land).

Democratic lawmakers hope to ease rules for death by assisted suicide

SB-380 approved by the legislature 9/10/21 if signed by the governor on or before 10/10/21 will streamline the process for death through assisted suicide by decreasing the waiting period

between requests from 15 days to 48 hours, eliminating the second written attestation, and extending the law's expiration date from 2026 to 2031. Current law requires that the person requesting assisted suicide be diagnosed with a terminal illness with an estimated life-expectancy of less than 6 months. The primary and consulting physicians must concur and judge that the person is of sound mind. The written attestation also requires the signatures of 2 witnesses who have personal knowledge of the requestor.

Bill allowing minors to consent to "sensitive" services without parental consent on Newsom's desk

AB 1184 would allow minors to make irrevocable changes to their bodies without parental consent

Held until next year – the 2022 legislative session

Vaccine Mandate Bills

AB 455 which requires vaccination in order to access hotels, restaurant dining, and entertainment venues

AB 1102 Seeks to order an employer to require a COVID-19 vaccination as a condition of employment.

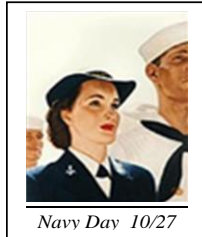
