President's Report

We must be Always There and Always Vigilant

Human trafficking is happening all over the world and the United States is no exception. According to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, human trafficking has been reported in all 50 states (NCMEC, 2022).

The National Human Trafficking Hotline, funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and operated by Polaris, a Washington, D.C.-based nongovernmental organization, reported that in 2021, 10,359 situations of human trafficking were reported to the hotline, involving 16,554 individual victims. As shocking as these numbers are, these reports are very likely only a fraction of the actual problem (Polaris, 2021).

Child trafficking is a \$38-50 billion per year criminal enterprise. It generates more annual revenue than the MLB, NFL, NBA, and NHL combined! Forty-four percent of trafficked children are trafficked by their own parent, guardian, or other family member.

In 2022, MRWF raised over \$70,000 for a local nonprofit, New Day for Children. Please consider attending their event in September. This 501(c)3 seeks to restore the stolen childhood of recovered sexually trafficked children. They raise and provide financial support for restorative care, providing a safe and secure living environment, school tuition, therapy, medical, dental and vision care, equine therapy and other essential needs.

By California law, schools are to teach the Constitution on this day. Most schools do not know this; so you can help them.

Davy Crockett, Still King of the Wild Frontier*

On Davy Crockett's 200th birthday, Paul Andrew Hutton chose to research and write about the American folk hero who had first sparked his interest in history. These are excerpts from Hutton's essay —

It seemed a good time to come to grips with this historical figure. A lot of illusions fall away along the road toward a doctorate in American history, and I had emerged jaded and cynical. If truth be told, I wanted to dismantle Crockett — to free myself from the shackles of childhood hero worship and prove once and for all my maturity and credibility as a scholar.

As I expected, much of the Crockett legend fell apart under even casual scrutiny. He was, in essence, a nineteenth-century celebrity — perhaps the first American to make a living portraying his own fanciful image. He didn't kill a bear when he was three, didn't care much for fighting Indians, didn't go down swinging Old Betsy at the Alamo (he left his favorite rifle in Tennessee, and yes, it's true — he surrendered at the Alamo). But something unexpected began to happen even as the myth began to unravel. I found myself liking Davy Crockett. He is that rarest of American icons: a legendary hero who turns out, after all, to have been more or less a decent, admirable human being.

Legislative Report

Taxpayers Fuel the State that Could

California public school students starting the 2022/2023 school year are eligible to receive “free” breakfast and lunch during the school year. Lower income students are also eligible for “free” meals during the summer break. State control of food gradually increases.

\$5 billion was cut from the \$54 billion 2021/2022 California state budget for the phase out of oil and natural gas. State control of energy tightens.

The Temecula Valley School Board agreed to purchase the state approved fourth-grade social studies materials promoting Harvey Milk after being threatened by Governor Newsom with a \$1.5 million fine. The state flaunts its control of student indoctrination.

Bills to oppose:

AB-1078 Instructional materials and curriculum: diversity (Jackson) would further increase state control of school curriculum.

AB 665 Minors: consent to mental health services (Carrillo) removes the provision that minors must be a danger to themselves or others, or a victim of abuse to obtain mental health services without parental consent. If passed, this law will strip parental rights and leave children aged 12 and older subject to the whims of state-paid counsellors. This bill would tighten state control over minors.

AB 957 Family law: gender identity (Wilson) would instruct judges to consider the parent’s affirmation of gender identity in custody cases. This bill threatens parents who disagree with gender ideology.

AB-223 Change of gender and sex identifier (Ward) would make gender change court proceedings of minors confidential. This bill facilitates a gender ideology which mutilates children and renders them sterile.

AB-443 Peace officers: determination of bias (Jackson) will use the “appearance of bias” in social media posts in disciplinary cases. This bill would help the state cull police officers who do not agree with their agenda.

AB-4 Covered California: expansion (Arambula) would increase outreach and marketing to ensure enrollment of those who are otherwise not eligible for health coverage because of immigration status. This bill allows the state to further devalue citizenship and transfer wealth to non-citizens.

AB-91 Community colleges: exemption from nonresident tuition fee: residence near the California-Mexico border (Alvarez) would grant low-income Mexican residents who live within 45 miles of the border resident tuition. This bill would help further erase the border and transfer wealth to non-citizens.

Good news:

AB 659 Cancer Prevention Act (Aguiar-Curry) now states that HPV vaccination for incoming 8th graders and college students is “recommended” making it clearer that this is not a requirement.
