In 2017 Sanders was awarded Tracy's Woman Citizen of the Year. Her support of women's causes encouraged her to apply to participate as an *Outwalker* with the Pasadena Celebrates 2020 float. She was chosen as one of a hundred women from across the United States to walk with the float in the Rose Parade to commemorate the 100 year anniversary of women winning the right to vote. Together with her fellow *Outwalkers*, they marched into history as they chanted "votes for women" and "on their shoulders they won the vote; on our shoulders we protect the vote."



Having served for a decade on the Tracy Hospital Board of Trustees, Cindy became the Board Chair and enjoyed the challenge of this position for three years. She then decided to join the GFWC Tracy Woman's Club where she served as 1st Vice President then President for two years. This led to a position as the GFWC District 1st Vice President, then to her current position as the GFWC District President. Cindy oversees 24 clubs and 1106 members.

As a proud fifth generation California farmer, Cindy inherited forty acres of Apricots that has been owned by her family since 1866. Cindy has a passion for philanthropy and has her own non-profit that raises and donates service dogs to Veterans. She believes in giving freedom back to those that have fought for ours. VOTE 'NO' ON THIS CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION

QUICK-REFERENCE GUIDE

PROP 13 AUTHORIZES BONDS FOR FACILITY REPAIR, CONSTRUCTION, AND MODERNIZATION AT PUBLIC PRESCHOOLS, K-12 SCHOOLS, COMMUNITY COLLEGES, AND UNIVERSITIES. LEGISLATIVE STATUTE.

SUMMARY *Put on the Ballot by the Legislature*

Authorizes \$15 billion in state general obligation bonds for construction and modernization of public education facilities. Fiscal Impact: Increased state costs to repay bonds estimated at about \$740 million per year (including interest) over the next 35 years.

WHAT YOUR VOTE MEANS

YES A YES vote on this measure means: The state could sell \$15 billion in general obligation bonds to fund school, community college, and university facility projects. In addition, school districts and community college districts would be authorized to issue more local bonds, and school districts would have new limits on their ability to levy developer fees.

NO A NO vote on this measure means: The state could not sell \$15 billion in general obligation bonds to fund education facility projects. The state also would not make changes to school districts' and community college districts' existing local borrowing limits or the existing rules for school districts to levy developer fees.

ARGUMENTS

PRO YES on PROP. 13 funds essential repairs to make California public schools safer and healthier. Removal of toxic mold and asbestos from aging classrooms. More school nurse facilities. Cleaner drinking water. Fire and earthquake safety upgrades. Strong taxpayer controls. Endorsed by firefighters, doctors, nurses, and teachers. For California's children. YesonProp13.com

CON This measure authorizes \$15 billion in borrowing, costing taxpayers \$27 billion including interest, to build and repair schools. Borrowing is nearly twice as expensive as paying for school construction from the regular budget, which has a huge \$21 billion surplus. This is just more government waste. Vote no.

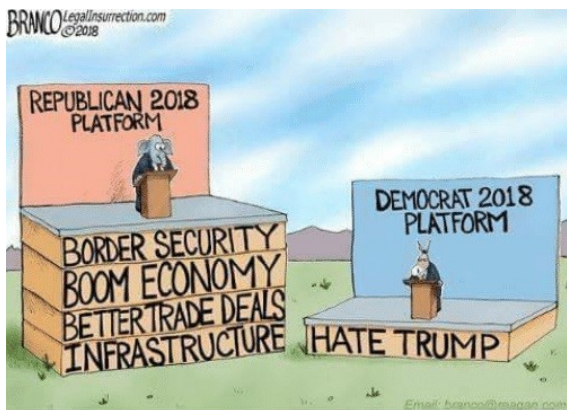
Action: Write to our California Senator Mike McGuire re: SB673 which was reviewed in the Senate Education Committee and voted down/killed in committee on January 17, 2020. The committee voted SB673 down on the premise that the current law provides an 'opt-out' for parents; it thus gives parents sufficient control over this curriculum and their children's participation in it.

CFRW Scholarships

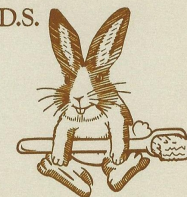

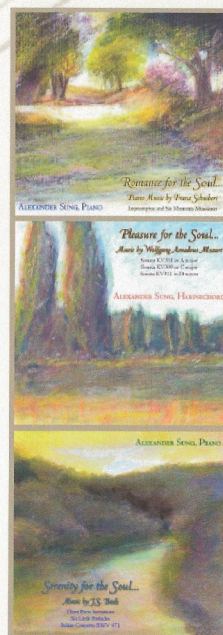
