Ron Ross Ph.D. is a former economics professor and author of *The Unbeatable Market*. He has been an American Spectator contributor since 2010.

Ross was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, grew up there, got his bachelor's degree in economics at the University of Tulsa, and Ph.D. at Oklahoma State University. He came to Humboldt County in 1969 to teach economics at what was then called Humboldt State College. He taught there for ten years and then switched from teaching economics to doing economics. He went into

private practice as an investment advisor. In 1990 he joined Wayne Caldwell and John Gloor and they later formed their firm Premier Financial Group. They currently have \$600 million dollars of asset under management and 15 employees.

When Mr. Ross came to California there was still some bigotry against Okies. That hurt his feelings at first then he remembered something Will Rogers had said. You probably know he was also from Oklahoma - what Will Rogers said was, "When the Okies came to California it raised the average IQs in both states." An observation Ross has – he says, "for numerous reasons many conservatives are currently leaving California. That will probably lower the average IQ in California back to where it had been."

In Celebration of Veterans' Day

The Great War (a.k.a. World War I)

The men memorialized here never knew that their war would be the first of two great World Wars. For them World War I was the "War in Europe" or the "Great War." In 1917, 1918 and 1919 many believed that this would be the last war. That the sacrifice of these men would ensure that future generations would not have to fight another war.

When the United States officially entered the war on April 6th, 1917, the "Great Powers" had been engaged in wholesale slaughter for nearly three years. The Americans who sailed for France in 1917 as part of the American Expeditionary Force (the AEF) were well aware of the carnage they were about to experience. When the Americans marched down the gangways of the ships in France in late June of 1917 they were greeted by an ecstatic civilian population and already weary French, British and Commonwealth troops desperate for relief.

The men of the AEF were called "Yankees" by the Europeans, but they called themselves "Doughboys" and the bronze statue here commemorates the typical Doughboy of the War. Many believed they were fighting to repay a historical national debt. France had sent aid to the Army of George Washington during America's War of Independence against Great Britain. In return, nearly one hundred and forty years later, America sent her sons to France and when the Doughboys marched down the gangways many shouted, "Lafayette, we have arrived!"

Over the course of less than two years nearly two million Americans would be transported to Europe. Over one million would see active service on the front lines. Over two hundred thousand would be wounded. Over fifty thousand would die in combat. Over sixty-five thousand additional men would be lost due to disease and other causes. The men memorialized on this plaque sadly did not make it home to Marin. But they were not forgotten by their relatives, friends, neighbors and comrades in arms.

In the next 30 (now 8) days these are the places that matter ... We really DO need every vote and then some, and I don't care if California stays blue, I want every red vote to be counted too!


