Dr. Michael Hartnett is a Marin County native who has been involved in politics since an early age. At age 17 Michael matriculated at UC Berkeley and majored in Biology before going on to St. Louis to attend medical school. After graduation he returned to California and completed an Infectious Disease Fellowship at Kaiser in Los Angeles. His career has included hospital consulting, urgent care, and the evolving world of HIV medicines. He currently practices part time.

He has been a dedicated Republican volunteer since 2002 when he worked to help recall Governor Gray Davis. In 2006 he was the Republican nominee for State Assembly. He serves on MarinGOP Central Committee and contributes frequently to various publications.

Since 2020 Dr. Hartnett has become increasingly concerned by the rise of censorship in the world of science. Will patients receive the care they need and deserve if medicine is forced to conform to a narrative? Are rigorous scientific protocols being followed? What is the true cost of censorship in medicine?

Paul Johnson's A History of the American People

"The creation of the United States of America is the greatest of all human adventures. No other national story has such tremendous lessons, for the American people and for the rest of mankind." So begins [A History of the American People](#), written by Paul Johnson, the prolific historian (more than 50 books) who died last month at the age of 94. Since February is the month we celebrate the American presidency, let's look at this classic work from that aspect.

Johnson, an Englishman, wrote about our presidents with an outsider's perspective. He was talented, he wrote "sharp profiles of people, incredibly detailed and engaging at the same time—incapable of writing a boring sentence." He showed how Grover Cleveland and Teddy Roosevelt ushered in the age of big business and industry and how Woodrow Wilson revolutionized the government's role. He offered new views of Harding, Coolidge, and Hoover and of Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal and his role as commander in chief during World War II. He examined the unforeseen greatness of Harry Truman and reassessment of Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon, Reagan, and Bush.

This classic is a great, well-written American history with superb details of our presidents, a good gift to any student forced to study American history via Howard Zinn.

Satellite Club

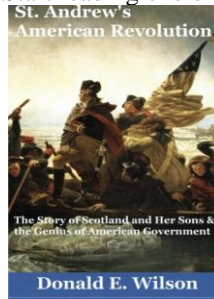

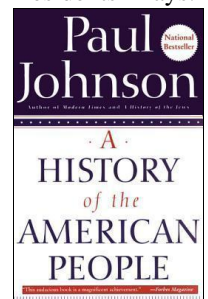

Legislative Report

A Faux Religion?

AB 44, the California State Fur Ban went into effect January 1, 2023. The bill introduced by Glendale Assemblywoman Laura Friedman was signed into law by Governor Newsom on October 12, 2019. The law bans the sale and production of new fur products. Californians are still allowed the use of cow, sheep, and goat hides.

The “animal rights” agenda extends beyond the prevention of cruelty to animals and the promotion of sustainable animal husbandry. Consider the mission statement of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA); “Animals are not ours to experiment on, *eat*, *wear*, use for entertainment or abuse in any other way.” The pejorative term “speciesism” coined by English philosopher Richard D. Ryder is given to those who disagree. According to the Bible, God made man in his image, gave him dominion over the creatures of the earth (Genesis 1:26), and provides for his needs (Mathew 6:30). “Animal rights” activists work zealously to construct their vision. They use the force of government to prevent others from enjoying God’s gifts.

In response to the extinction of carrier pigeons and decreased populations of bison, bald eagles, and whales, the 1972 Marine Mammal Protection Act and the Endangered Species Act of 1973 were signed into law by President Nixon. Many species of seals are not endangered, but US residents are prohibited from hunting seals (with an exemption for Alaskan Natives) or importing sealskin (valued for its warmth and waterproof qualities).

Natural fur has underfur which traps air and acts as an insulator. (Wearing multiple layers of clothing keeps us warmer because of the trapped air between layers.) Caribou and moose even have hollow hairs for added insulation. The outer layer of guard hairs is oily and acts as a moisture barrier. Fur is breathable, allowing air to pass through the material. In contrast, faux fur is made from petroleum products, has only one length of fiber and does not insulate as well, is not moisture resistant or breathable, sheds microplastics, and is not biodegradable.

California Laws Effective 2023

HEALTH CARE

Gender-affirming care: [SB107](#) aims to make California a sanctuary state for transgender health care, shielding transgender people, including youth and their parents, from legal action from states with bans and restrictions.

Abortion: Several reproductive healthcare-related measures have either already taken effect or will at the start of the year in response to the United State Supreme Court’s decision to overturn federal abortion protections, which restricted access to the procedure in several states. This includes laws that protect medical records and cooperation with out-of-state entities regarding abortion restrictions ([AB2091](#), [AB1242](#)), expands abortion training options and providers ([SB1375](#)), and protections for people from criminal or civil liabilities for pregnancy loss or abortion ([AB 2223](#)).

COVID-19: [AB2693](#) requires workplaces to continue providing employees with COVID-19 exposure notifications until 2024.

[AB2098](#) makes it easier for the California Medical Board to punish doctors who spread COVID19 misinformation.

LABOR

Minimum wage increase: [SB3](#) (2016) will raise California’s minimum wage to \$15.50.

Pay transparency: [SB1162](#) requires employers to make salary ranges for available job positions to applicants and employees. It also sets new pay data reporting requirements based on gender and race.

Paid family leave: [SB951](#) increases the share of paid family leave provided to lower-income Californians. It extends what was a temporary increase in the benefit from 55% of wages to 60% to 70% depending on income. In 2025, the bill requires an increase of the benefit to 70%.

CRIME

Rape kits: [SB1228](#) prohibits law enforcement agencies from using the DNA collected from a sexual assault victim from being used in the investigation of an unrelated crime.

Free prison phone calls: [SB1008](#) provides free phone calls to people detained in California prisons and jails.

Rap lyrics in court: [AB2799](#) limits the use of creative expression, such as rap lyrics, as evidence in criminal cases.
