### Remembering the Horrors of D-Day\*

Eighty years ago, the Allies assaulted the Normandy beaches on D-Day, June 6, 1944. In an assault deemed almost impossible, they pulled it off. These moving words to remember and appreciate their heroic efforts: How and why did the Americans on Omaha charge right off their landing craft into a hail of German machine gun and artillery fire, despite being mowed down in droves. In a word, they "believed" in the United States.

That generation had emerged from the crushing poverty of the Great Depression to face the reality that the Axis powers wanted to destroy their civilization and their country. They were confident in American know-how. They were convinced that they were fighting for the right cause. They were not awed by traveling thousands of miles from home to face German technological wizardry, veterans with years of battle experience, and a ruthless martial code. They understood, like their predecessors at Valley Forge, Gettysburg, and the Meuse-Argonne, that nothing in the United States was guaranteed. They accepted that periodically, some Americans—usually those in the prime of life with the greatest futures and the most to lose—would be asked to face certain death in nightmarish places like Omaha, a B-17 over Berlin, or the horrid jungles in the Pacific.

The least that our generation—affluent, leisured, and so often self-absorbed—can do is to remember who they were, what they did, and how much we owe them.

## **Legislative Report**

SB 905 Crimes: theft from a vehicle. (Wiener) The San Francisco Police Department reported 20,000 auto break-ins and Oakland reported 15,000 auto break-ins in 2023. There are very few convictions. During the first 7 months of 2023, the San Francisco DA's office filed eighty-six cases and obtained forty-five convictions for an estimated conviction rate of 1 in 4000. Car burglary requires proof that the car was locked. The victim may be asked to testify in court, which is unreasonable for many tourists. If the vehicle was forcibly entered, there is circumstantial evidence that the vehicle was locked. This bill makes it a misdemeanor or felony to forcibly enter a vehicle with the intent to commit theft. In addition, possession of stolen property exceeding \$950 from a vehicle or vehicles with the intent to sell this property would also be a crime. The only meaningful change to existing law may be the ability to bundle episodes of stolen property possessions together to increase the charge from a misdemeanor to a felony. Residents are concerned about car thefts. This bill allows Senator Wiener to appear to be trying to reduce car thefts as he seeks reelection.

**SB 1094 Pupil instruction:** course of study: social sciences: civic engagement. (Limon) This bill would require instruction on the state and federal constitutions and democratic principles in grades 1 through 6 and again in grade 7 or 8. The bill also requires two civic engagement experiences. The Senate Education Committee unanimously approved the bill, but the Senate Appropriations Committee suspended the bill, so it is unlikely to pass. Parents are concerned about the curriculum taught in our schools, and legislators share this concern during election years.

AB 2196 Beaver restoration: (Connolly-Marin) Under existing law it is illegal to trap for sport or commerce any fur bearing animal. One can apply for a permit to kill beavers that are destroying property. This bill will require the Department of Fish and Wildlife to design a plan to restore the beaver population in California. There is no opposition to this bill.

SB 1283 Students and Social Media: requires schools to adopt policy that limits or prohibits the use of social media and smart phones while at school, with exceptions for emergencies and use for school curriculum or projects. AB 3080 Porn exposure: early exposure to porn influences the transgender identity adoption and harms children in other ways. This bill that requires age-verification before anyone can consume online porn. ### **EIPCa Legislative Alert**

Beginning with good news: **AB 2050**, the second attempt to ally California to the disastrous and highly partisan <u>Electronic Registration Information Center</u> (ERIC), is now languishing in the Appropriations Committee suspense file for the second time.

One of EIPCa's objections to the bill was the cost to the State, which is facing a \$70+ billion deficit. For now, the Appropriations Committee agrees.

California citizens will still need to keep a close watch for yet another resurgence.

The next 'Clear and Present Danger' is **Senate Bill (SB) 1174**, which will be up for a floor vote in the State Senate very soon.

Please read <u>EIPCa's letter of opposition</u> and then <u>contact your</u> <u>State Senator by email or phone</u> to express how your Senator can best represent your desires when voting.

Then be prepared to reach out to your Assembly representative as the bill begins its journey through the Assembly Committee and floor vote process. (EIPCa will keep you posted.)

**SB 1174** was proposed in response to the action of the people of Huntington Beach, who voted in the last election to require voter ID for their local elections.

The bill would deny the people of that Charter City, and every other municipality in the state, the right to self-govern in the way they wish by forbidding the requirement of ID for any election at any level in the state.

EIPCa believes the law to be government over-reach and another attempt to allow the State to bully the California citizens at the local government level.


